Hi Jerome,

I refer to your request for an Airservices assessment of wind farm for the Wombelano Wind Energy Facility

Airspace Procedures

With respect to procedures designed by Airservices in accordance with ICAO PANS-OPS and Document 9905 at a maximum height of 430.34m/1412ft AHD, the wind farm and meteorological mast will not affect any sector or circling altitude, nor any instrument approach, departure procedure at any aerodrome nor any air routes.

Note: procedures not designed by Airservices were not considered in this assessment.

Communications/Navigation/Surveillance (CNS) Facilities

This wind farm, to a maximum height of 430.34m/1412ft AHD, will not adversely impact the performance of any Airservices Precision/Non-Precision Navigation Aids, Anemometers, HF/VHF/UHF Communications, A-SMGCS, Radar, PRM, ADS-B, WAM or Satellite/Links.

Summary

Based on the above assessment, Airservices view is that the proposed wind farm would not have an impact on the safety, efficiency or regularity of existing, or future air transport operations into or out of any airport.

Vertical Obstacle Notification

As this proposed wind farm is in excess of 30m (99ft) AGL, as soon as construction commences, the proponent must complete the Vertical Obstacle Notification Form for tall structures and submit the completed form to VOD@airservicesaustralia.com

Hi

My company is developing a wind farm in Western Victoria (Wombelano Wind Farm), consisting of up to 7 wind turbines up to 250 m AGL and a meteorological mast to 120 m AGL.

We are intending to install our met mast shortly - subject to COVID restrictions. We have submitted our Building Permit to West Wimmera Shire Council. No Planning Permit is required as the mast is to be installed for less than 3-years (per VPP 62.02-1) otherwise a valid Planning Permit is required.

We are also intending to submit a Planning Application to DELWP for the Wind Energy Facility in December and have developed an Aviation Impact Assessment for that submission.

Would you be able to confirm requirements for these items, from Airservices Australia's perspective?
