

Form to assist compliance with Regulation 77 of the Aboriginal Heritage Regulations 2018

Application for Certification of a Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Test (PAHT) for the purposes of the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006*

This form specifies the format in which an application should be prepared when a person is seeking certification of a Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Test (PAHT) under section 49B of the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006* (Act). A PAHT assists with determining whether the proposed activity requires the person to prepare a cultural heritage management plan. After receiving a PAHT, within 21 days, the Secretary of the Department of Premier and Cabinet (Secretary) or their delegate must certify the PAHT is correct or refuse to certify it. The Secretary (or their delegate) may however request additional information considered necessary to assist with their decision (see the Act, ss 49B and 49C). To be a valid application, a PAHT must be accompanied by the prescribed fee.



It is an offence under section 46 of the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006* to commence an activity for which a cultural heritage management plan is required, without such a plan having been approved. Authorised officers may attend the subject land to monitor compliance with the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006*.
